

DAME KARLENE DAVIS DBE TO CHAIR THE BOUNTY ADVISORY BOARD

London, 11 October 2013 – The UK's largest parenting club, Bounty, today announced an Advisory Board, chaired by former General Secretary of the Royal College of Midwives (RCM), Dame Karlene Davis DBE.

The Bounty Advisory Board will meet three times per year and will publish its official recommendations on the Bounty website.

Dame Karlene Davis DBE commented on her appointment as the Advisory Board's Chair, saying: "I am delighted to serve as the Chair of Bounty's new Advisory Board. From my years of working with women and maternity services, I know that new Mothers want to have choice and information, and of course what's best for their newborn. For some Mothers the Bounty bag is their only source of helpful information, guidance and free samples of useful products. For others it is a welcome addition to the information and advice which they may already have accessed. It is important that new families receiving marketing and promotional offers do not feel compelled or obligated to disclose information at the time surrounding birth, and that parenting clubs conform to the highest standards in their interactions with parents on maternity wards. Bounty is committed to conforming to the letter and spirit of the various codes that govern this activity and to ensure that they abide by accepted practice. As Chair of the Bounty Advisory Board, I look forward to working with my fellow Board members to ensure that Bounty continues to improve and provide a high standard of service to mums across the UK."

Clare Goodrham, UK General Manager of Bounty said: "We are pleased to announce the launch of the Bounty Advisory Board and are very pleased that that Dame Karlene will be chairing the Board. For the past 54 years, Bounty has worked in partnership with the NHS to provide essential health information and free products to generations of new mums. As part of Bounty's commitment to continuously improving its service, Bounty has also introduced a number of other new initiatives:

From June 2013, Bounty staff began handing out 'How did we do?' feedback cards to new mums they visit, in order to provide an additional source of easy and anonymous feedback and suggestions. 5,600 new mums have responded with their feedback and suggestions and their average satisfaction score has improved since June and is now rated 8.6 out of 10
- Free Midwife Helpline for new mums: Beginning in September and thanks to
 Bounty's partnership with Tommy's the baby charity; all new mums are also
 being given details of a free helpline manned by Tommy's midwives. This
 provides extra support to any new mum in the first ten days following the birth
 of her baby.
- Sleep Safety leaflet: Working with The Lullaby Trust, which promotes expert
 advice on sleep safety for babies and support for bereaved parents, Bounty will
 also include a new booklet featuring practical information on sleep safety in all
 its Newborn Packs from October. This forms an important part of Bounty's

- Dame Karlene Davis DBE served as General Secretary of the Royal College of Midwives for 14 years. She is the former Director of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Midwifery; Regional Representative for Europe in the International Confederation of Midwives; a Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine, and a member of the Wellbeing Council at the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists. Dame Karlene was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Science by the University of Greenwich. She became one of the most senior black women in the health profession and the UK's first black woman trade union leader. In 2001, she was made a Dame Commander of the British Empire in recognition of her services to midwifery and the NHS.
- Carole Garrick is an experienced Supervisor of Midwives and has worked as a midwife on the Isle of Wight; the midwifery manager of a birth centre in the New Forest and a senior manager for midwifery led services in Southampton. In 2003 she went to work in Wales as the Head of Midwifery for Gwent Healthcare Trust. In 2008 Carole moved back to the South Coast of England where she currently works as an Associate Director/Head of Midwifery. She is extremely proud of Midwifery as a profession and was delighted when she was elected to serve as a member of the Royal College of Midwives Council in 2007. In 2011 she was elected to the Royal College of Midwives Board where she served as a Director for 2 years until August 2013.

- Francine Bates is the Chief Executive of the charity, The Lullaby Trust which promotes expert advice on safer sleep for babies and provides specialist support for bereaved families. Francine has worked in the children and family sector for the best part of 20 years. Between 2000 and 2007, Francine was Chief Executive of Contact a Family, a leading charity that supports parents of disabled children across the UK. Francine previously worked as a policy adviser at the Department of Education advising on Sure Start Children's Centres, child poverty and child health.
